This dataset contains information on the characteristics of the households and the intervention implemented in Tangier, Morocco. The data includes information on the household's location, the type of housing, the quality of the water supply, and the type of sanitation. The intervention was a randomized controlled trial that compared the effects of a water and sanitation intervention to a control group. The intervention included the installation of a water tap and a toilet. The control group received no intervention. The data was collected from 2010 to 2012. The dataset is available in Stata format.
