- Short essay questions (300 word limit for each) :
 - Q1. The goal of the ARTEMIS program is to support early-career researchers to design and pursue funding for an RCT on issues related to poverty in the US context. Ideally, by the end of the program, each ARTEMIS participant will produce a high-quality RCT proposal ready to submit for funding from philanthropies, government agencies, or J-PAL North America. Please describe the primary research question that will serve as the foundation of your proposal.
 - Q2. Please describe how the ARTEMIS program will impact your educational and career trajectory. Does this program fill a gap in your training thus far? Will the program enable you to pursue a research project you would not otherwise be able to?

- Applicants should identify a mentor or professor who is familiar with their academic and research experience. Letter writers will be asked the following:
 - Please provide a letter of recommendation for the applicant for the ARTEMIS program. In your letter (300 word limit) please speak to the following:
 - Technical training in and experience with quantitative research methods.
 - How admission to the ARTEMIS program will impact their educational and career trajectory. Does the program fill a gap in their training? Will it enable them to pursue a research project they would not otherwise be able to?
 - Ability to take initiative and lead tasks and projects, of all scales, from conception to finish.
