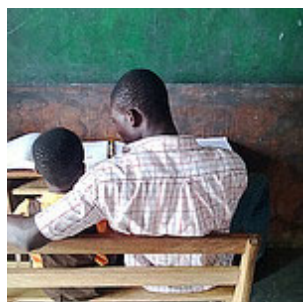


IMPACT EVALUATION COURSE

Innovations for Poverty Action (IPA) and the **Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL)** are pleased to announce a custom impact evaluation workshop, hosted jointly with members of the University Of Zambia (UNZA). This workshop is intended to build capacity in understanding basic methods of impact evaluation and learning to critically use evidence in the policy decision-making process.



WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Members of the Government, development practitioners, and researchers from Zambian institutions are invited to attend a four-day workshop, which will highlight the importance of impact evaluations and help develop the skills needed to understand randomised evaluations.



COURSE CONTENT

The course will consist of two streams: the *researcher stream* and the *policymaker stream*. Both streams will have the same core. The core of the course will be content on key components of randomised evaluations. This will include, why evaluation is important, different kinds of impact evaluation, the benefits of randomization, as well as the threats to randomisation.

The *researcher stream* will have supplementary material on the more technical aspects of evaluations, such as power calculations. The *policymaker stream* will have supplementary material on identifying good evidence and how to use evidence in policy making.
