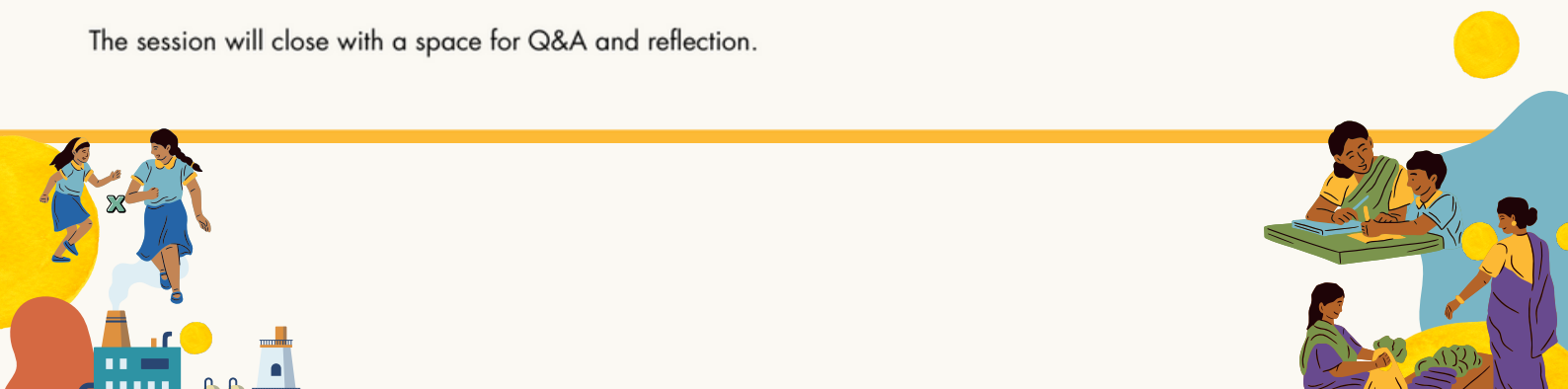
Scale-Up Stories : ASPIRE Projects in the Spotlight

Shifting Gears : Advancing Systems Change through Research and Funding

Even the most effective pilots often fail when scaled - because systems aren't often ready. Lasting scale demands systems that can learn, adapt, and endure. Yet systems change is notoriously hard: delivery conditions shift, political priorities evolve, and impact often declines as programs expand. The challenge is to make evidence part of the everyday machinery of government, so improvements not only spread, but last.

In this lightning talk, Shagun Sabarwal draws on her dual perspective as both researcher and funder to explore different dimensions of systems change.
